Hope's Haven Camp Covid Guidelines for Camp 2021

As of April 25, 2021 here are the guidelines regarding Covid-19 for our summer camp.

Upon arrival, each camper must provide the 14 day Heath Questionnaire and have a temperature check.

Each staff person will also be temperature checked upon arrival.

Each staff and camper will have a daily temperature check. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or greater, or with two or more symptoms of covid 19 will be isolated. Parent/guardian will be called to pick camper up from isolation area at camp.

The majority of our time spent at camp will be outside. The only time we will be indoors is in the cabins for sleeping, in case of rain, or to get meals. If weather permits, all meals will be eaten outside.

Each cabin will have a maximum of 11 people (6 campers and 5 staff) and will be a 'Pod' for the duration of camp.

When will masks be required?

- Arrival and check in
- Any time indoors (other than cabins for sleeping)
- During transition to different activities
- While singing
- Interacting closely with groups from other 'Pods'
- Any child or staff that wants to wear a mask/face covering at other times that those listed are welcome to do so

When are masks NOT required?

- Eating or sleeping (these activities will happen in their assigned 'Pods')
- Outdoor exertional activities (field games and active outdoor play)
- When outdoor with their 'Pod'

According to the latest CDC guidelines, campers and staff will be at least 3 feet from each other during non-exertional activities.

All staff and campers will be required to have a mask with them at all times.

The following strategies have been implemented to help limit the spread of Covid-19.

- Increased opportunities for hand-washing and sanitizing
- Physical distancing
- Staff training on Covid-19 symptoms and camp policies
- Avoid use of items that are not easily cleaned and disinfected
- Provide each camper with their own supplies that will not be shared with other campers
- Camp and cabins limited to 50% occupancy for social distancing
- Touched surfaces will be regularly cleaned and disinfected throughout the day

What if someone is confirmed with a probable or possible case of Covid-19?

- Any camper or staff diagnosed with a probable or possible case of Covid-19 will be isolated and arrangements made for them to go home.
- The local health department as well as parents of campers that attended that camp will be notified immediately. All campers and staff in the affected 'pod' will quarantine per CDC guidelines.
